Couple allegedly partners in crime in Orangeburg: cops

Timothy and Stacy Kaiser, husband and wife, are partners in crime, literally, according to police.

Less than a week after <u>her husband was arrested in Orangeburg</u>, Stacy Kaiser was taken into custody for allegedly working with him to steal boxes of cables from a technology services firm, Orangetown police said.

The couple from Waldwick, New Jersey, allegedly stole more than \$50,000 worth of unshielded twisted pair data cable and security cable from USIS, which is based at 35 West Jefferson Ave. in Pearl River. The company has a warehouse at 25 Ramland Road in Orangeburg, where Timothy Kaiser, 44, allegedly stole boxes of cable, a generator and other items during the last few months, police said.

Timothy Kaiser was arrested on June 26. Stacy Kaiser, 42, was arrested on Wednesday and charged with second-degree grand larceny and second-degree criminal possession of stolen property, both felonies.

She was arraigned in Orangetown Justice Court and released on \$25,000 bail, police said. She is due back in court on Wednesday.

Detectives from the Rockland County District Attorney's office worked with Orangetown police on the investigation.
