Employee stole \$50K worth of equipment: cops

A man allegedly pocketed more than just pens or paperclips from his Rockland employer, police said.

Timothy Donald Kaiser allegedly stole more than \$50,000 worth of equipment from technology services firm USIS, whose corporate headquarters is at 35 West Jefferson Ave. in Pearl River, Orangetown police said.

The Waldwick, New Jersey, resident has been accused of stealing boxes of UTP data cable and security cable, as well as a generator and other items, from a company warehouse at 25 Ramland Road in Orangeburg during the last few months, police said. He allegedly removed the property both while he was

working and during non-business hours, police said.

Kaiser, 44, was arrested on Friday and charged with second-degree grand larceny and second-degree criminal possession of stolen property, police said.

He was arraigned in Orangetown Justice Court and remanded to the Rockland County jail in lieu of \$100,000 bail, police said.
